Seeker Oncology Research Fellowship

The Colorado State University Flint Animal Cancer Center (FACC) is soliciting applications for a 2-year Research Fellowship. The goal of the fellowship is to provide comprehensive research training for clinical specialists committed to an academic career. Research experience is gained under the mentorship of established scientists at the FACC. The Fellowship provides 2 years of salary and research funding, with an opportunity to maintain clinical skills through participation in clinical/diagnostic services appropriate to their specialty. A mentor committee will be established to provide guidance to the Fellow. During the course of the two years, the Fellow will take advantage of seminar series, grant writing workshops, course work (including ethics), meeting with invited speakers, and other opportunities offered throughout the University. These will be arranged with the advice of the mentor committee.

The Fellowship is open to veterinarians who have completed specialty training in a discipline related to cancer (e.g. medical oncology, radiation oncology, surgery, diagnostic radiology, clinical/anatomic pathology, laboratory animal medicine). Salary is \$75,000 annually plus benefits, with a maximum of \$15,000 per year in discretionary research funds. Participants may qualify for the NIH Loan Repayment Program. Up to 8 weeks of clinical participation per year is allowable.

To apply, please supply a current CV (including the contact information for 3 referees) and letter of intent. Application materials must be received by January 15, 2022, and applicants will be notified regarding acceptance no later than February 15, 2022.
